ADVENT RECAP

This week for advent we light the Peace Candle. It represents the anticipation of the peace that Christ brings to our hearts and lives. Purple again symbolizes repentance and preparation for the Lord's coming.

Isaiah writes in Isaiah 40:3-5, "A voice of one calling: 'In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' 700 years before Jesus was born, Isaiah foretold of a day when the Messiah would come and reveal His glory. John said, We have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. True peace is possible through knowing the Prince of Peace."

Prayer: Father, as we light this candle of peace, we ask that You prepare our hearts for Your coming. Clear the paths in our lives that keep us from You, and make room in our hearts for Your peace and presence. May we welcome You with open hearts and lives prepared for Your glory. Amen.
