and break its seals?”

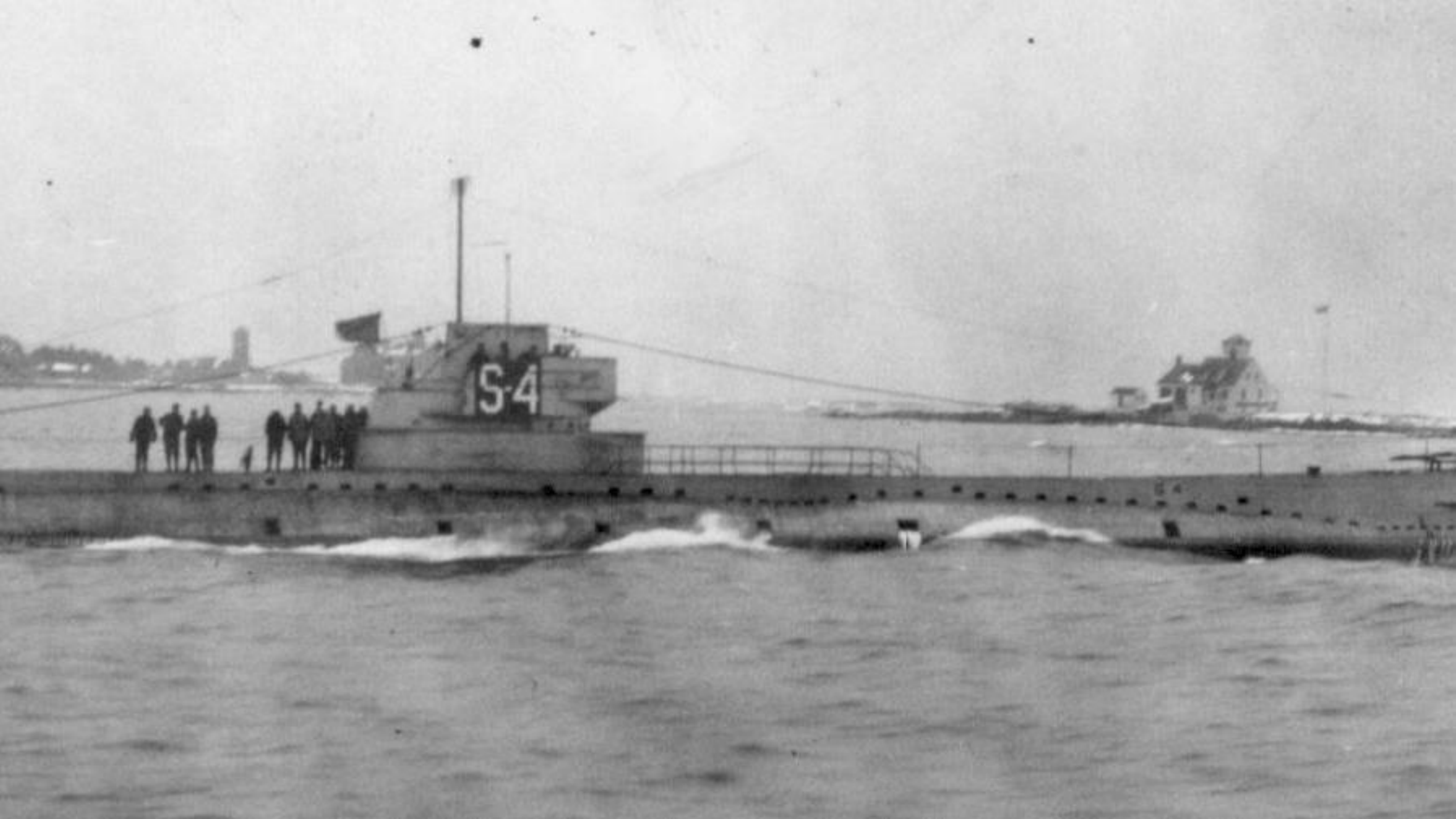




# The Question: Who is worthy?

## **The Answer: The Conquering Lamb.**

<sup>6</sup>And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. <sup>7</sup>And he went and took the scroll from the right hand of him who was seated on the throne.





# The Response : Worship.

<sup>8</sup> And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.

Missions is not the ultimate goal of the church.  
Worship is. **Missions exists because worship doesn't.**  
Worship is ultimate, not missions, because God is  
ultimate, not man. When this age is over and the  
countless millions of the redeemed fall on their faces  
before the throne of God, missions will be no more. It is  
a temporary necessity. But worship abides forever.  
Worship, therefore, is the fuel and goal of missions. It's  
the goal of missions because in missions we simply  
aim to bring the nations into the white-hot enjoyment  
of God's glory.

The goal of missions is the gladness of the peoples in the greatness of God. “The Lord reigns, let the earth rejoice; let the many coastlands be glad!” (Ps. 97:1). “Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you! Let the nations be glad and sing for joy” (Ps. 67:3–4). **But worship is also the fuel of missions.**



Passion for God in worship precedes the offer of God in preaching. You can't commend what you don't cherish. Missionaries will never call out, "Let the nations be glad!" if they cannot say from the heart, "I rejoice in the Lord"; "I will be glad and exult in you; I will sing praise to your name, O Most High" (Pss. 104:34; 9:2). **Missions begins and ends in worship.**
